Developed repair tracking systems that supported 4 separate operational commodities and \$4.8M of assets.

Coordinated and supervised all procedures to ensure strict compliance and use of funds and spare assets. Led and supervised 74 Marines and their day-to-day activities.

- Supervised daily maintenance functions and administrative activities for 4 separate maintenance activities.
- Performed annual budget planning that supported all maintenance activities and their directly related supply support commodity.
- Developed and instituted all maintenance activity deployment plans and operations.
- Revamped equipment and personnel reporting systems, increasing report accuracy from 85% to 100%.
- Streamlined the equipment repair process by reducing the average repair cycle time from 10 to 4 days.
- Monitored the performance of all repair actions and ensured all Quality Assurance requirements are met.
- Ensured the proper and prompt usage of all maintenance administrative processes and item procurement documentation requirements.
- Supervised all required reporting, shipping, and supply documentation requirements as outlined by the vendor warrantee program and government contract stipulations.

August 2016 – December 2018 **Platoon Leader: Multi-Mission Set** **Al Taqaddum/Al Asad, Iraq**

Directly supervised 18 personnel, up to 40 with augmented mission forces. In command of a Combined Arms platoon with responsibility for rapidly responding to direct attacks and eliminating potential threats to the post and surrounding areas. Responsible for the security of third country fuel trucks in convoy escorts from Central Iraq to Jordan and back. Responsible for all equipment as well as the morale, welfare, and training of all my personnel.

- Created an automated form to implement a new method of synchronizing several departments to provide vehicle maintenance, which reduced the maintenance completion time from 20 hours to 1.5 hours.
- Built a secure database-driven web application to provide real-time logistical information to a remote operations center – this replaced a paper-based system and reduced the time delay for information transfer, eliminated the loss of critical manpower for hand delivery, and replaced hand-copying with instant transfer of information.
- Established a job fair for soldiers returning from Iraq, coordinating with the local congressman to increase employer response, and mentored soldiers on resume preparation and interview skills.
- Enforced health, safety, training and maintenance standards to achieve 100% readiness throughout deployment.
- Tutored and encouraged 16 personnel enrolled in online college, to help them achieve their learning objectives.
- Ensured promotions and awards were timely and deserved. Worked diligently with subordinates to develop their leadership skills and personal goals.
- Led over 100 force protection patrols, and commanded over 70 fuel convoy movements from central Iraq to Jordan and back. These convoys involved the logistical planning, security and maintenance of 125 third country national trucks and drivers.
